A) CEO - No report. \$1,232.00 worth of building permits have been issued since January 2020

B) Oswego County Legislator Herb Yerdon gave his report

- Legislator's will be having their first meeting Thursday June 11th at 7pm
- As of June 8th 9,286 tests were done in Oswego County. There are roughly 135,000 residents in Oswego County.
 - 111 were positive
 - 9,047 were negative
 - 10 are currently still positive
 - 98 have recovered
 - 3 deaths
 - 47 in mandatory isolation
- SUNY Upstate COVID 19 vehicle testing site will be at Pulaski High School June 11th from 10am-3:45pm by appointment only and at no cost. If you have medical insurance that information will be necessary when you call, however no one will be refused regardless of insurance.
- Restaurants have been allowed to reopen with outside dinning. Tables must be placed 6 feet apart, all staff must wear a mask, and customers must wear a mask anytime not seated. A maximum of 10 people are allowed per table. Barber shops and hair salons have been allowed to reopen with new restrictions. DISCUSSION:

a) Materials for repairing the siding have been ordered and as soon as it comes in it will be fixed. The front door also needs to be fixed as it is sticking and not shutting properly.

b) COVID-19 updates- Inside dining at bars and restaurants will be allowed with restrictions on Friday June 12^{th}

c) The playground sustained damage due to improper use of playground equipment. The silo climber was pulled a foot out of the 2 feet it was buried in the ground and cemented in concrete. Teenagers were seen climbing and hanging off the climber. Ryan will be repairing the silo climber this week by re-cementing it in the ground. Research for a caution sign and proper equipment use sign is being done. The community is asked to be respectful of playground equipment and police others using the equipment. If damage damages continues then the playground will close permanently.

d) Verizon has expressed interest in installing a cell tower around the water tower. Supervisor Potter is researching the property easement restrictions before going forward.

e) CHIPS money was reduced by \$2.90. Paid NY was reduced by \$.66. Extreme weather is the same as last year. \$17,606.11.

PUBLIC COMMENT: Shirley Downes brought to the attention of the town and highway department that the dead end sign is missing from the end of Gay Drive. Superintendent Henry said he would get a new one up.
