REPORTS:

A) Water Operator Eric Pappa gave his report. There are 9 meter pits left to install, by the end of next week the rest of the meter pits should be in. Currently the project is waiting on materials for building the pump house. The next steps will be continued restoration, getting the pump house operational, drain the tower, tower repairs and restoration, then the water system will be run by the pumps in Richland. There have been quiet a few problems that have been found since starting this water project. One most recent was a water main break that resulted in the loss of 30,000 gallons of water in 20 minutes. Another is how high the water pressure is. Mr. Pappa has since turned the pressure down to the psi it should be. Gretchen Flick asked if the water will be metered. Mr. Pappa answered that to receive the grants the Town of Orwell applied for and was awarded the water must be metered, however as of right now it is not in the plan to be billed as metered water. The meters will be used to detect possible leaks. The Town Hall will receive all information produced by the system and will allow Mr. Pappa for all his hard work on the water project.

B) CEO John Howland gave his report. He completed his training and has submitted a list of permits issued.

C) Highway Superintendent Jon Roser gave his report. The paving material has been strained and is waiting for the weather to cooperate to put it down. The 2019 dump truck needs brakes and the new hire is working out well.

D) Oswego County Legislator Herb Yerdon gave his report.

E) NOCA representative Bob Trainham gave his report. NOCA is in need of a new ambulance, however the cost is almost \$200,000 for a basic ambulance. Although it has been a struggle, NOCA is still operating within their budget. On May 20th at 11:30 the life net helicopter will be landing at NOCA and will be open for viewing.

F) Tug Hill Representative Heidi Tompson read Paul Baxter's report as written. She also read her own report.

DISCUSSION:

A. Matt Johnson from Tug Hill Commission land use control options presentation: Mr. Johnson discussed the different options for controlling land usage and topics such as zoning, subdivision, and solar regulations. A comprehensive plan is the first step in any land use regulations. The Town of Orwell had one put together in 2001 however it was never updated. The Town of Orwell needs to put together a Planning Board as well as a Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) before moving forward with an updated comprehensive plan. The goal of the Planning Board and ZBA will be to protect and keep the small-town charm that is Orwell. Jeff Graham and Jim Condon volunteered as members of the Planning Board and Bob Trainham and Angel Convey volunteered as members of the ZBA. B. Water Project payment application # 2 resolution: David Powers from Barton & Loguidice went over the payment application to use CDBG funds to pay Edge Civil Corporation line by line. As of right now NYS has not released any funds. Mr. Powers also gave an update on the proposed schedule for the construction of the pump house which is projected to begin after Memorial Day. Jim Condon asked about the cuttings in the pavement along County Route 2 and 22. Mr. Powers replied that the contractors were waiting for the dirt and stone to settle before they tamp it and repave it.
